



COMMUNITY WORKSHOP: CREATING A NEW VISION FOR THE MAIN STREET/CENTRAL EXPRESSWAY CORRIDOR

The City of Richardson needs your help to create a strategy for redevelopment and revitalization of Main Street and the Central Expressway Corridor—Richardson's original downtown and the major access route to the community, its business areas and neighborhoods.

The City will host a **Community Workshop** on **Wednesday, September 19, 2012,** to discuss concepts for the revitalization of the corridor based on input from the Open House held in July, a Focus Group Workshop and feedback obtained from the online survey and questionnaire. **This is the second of three community meetings planned for this phase of the project.**

(The Main Street/Central Expressway study area is approximately 415 acres in size, including the Central Expressway Corridor from generally the southern city limit to Arapaho Road and stretching east to Greenville Avenue/Abrams Road and west to Lindale Lane/Custer Road in some locations, as well as the City's historic downtown and the surrounding area. Both were identified for further study in the 2009 Comprehensive Plan.)
