

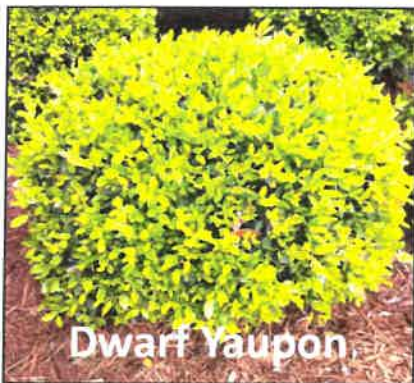


## 2115 Columbia Dr.

A Richardson resident for 17 years. Starting as a lawn of grass and a few boxwoods has been transformed into a little arboretum. The design and concept was Mrs. Worrell's creation. The goal was to create a xeriscape that would be beneficial to the wildlife and preserve our natural resources. As an extremely Earth friendly family the goal was to create a self replenishing and water smart landscape. The landscape includes host plants as well as nectar producing plants to promote our butterfly population, support the local pollinators, and native fauna. The Worrell's rely mostly on our five rain barrels, instead of city water. Some of the many benefits of planting Texas natives is their drought tolerance and ability survive the hot summers. Most Texas native plants can reseed and propagate each year as well, making them a good perennial to have in any landscape.

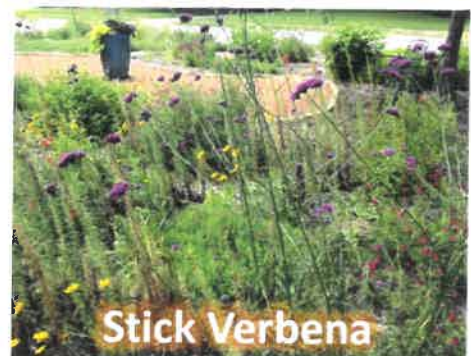

The “Hacienda on Waterview” boasts a mix of Spanish and Mission style architecture with a complimentary landscape varying from water-wise, heat-tolerant plants and natives to unusual container gardening assemblages with succulents, cactus, and bromeliads. The home of Carl Youngberg and David McNair has been featured in the Dallas Morning News and dubbed as the “Suburban Shangra-La.” Southern Living Magazine and other shelter magazines have called it an idea house. The gardens are extended living areas and plantings mixed with artwork, murals, and sculpture including repurposed doors and chandeliers.

# 3112 Cedar Ridge Dr.

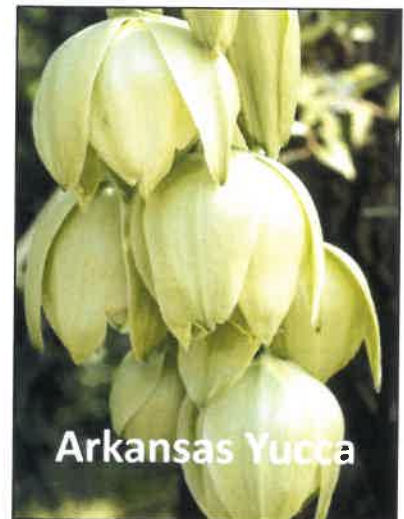
