**2. PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Karly Stern, 613 Cambridge Drive, Richardson, was present but no comments were made.

**3. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES**

**Board/Commission Action**

Chairperson Litke moved to approve the minutes as presented. Chairperson Martin seconded the motion. A vote was taken and approved unanimously.

**4. REVIEW AND DISCUSS THE SIDEWALK GAP ANALYSIS**

Michael Deasy, Mobility Planner, reviewed this item. He provided background on the network analysis, including existing gaps, data findings, revised prioritization criteria, funding considerations, and the webpage currently under development. He also outlined next steps for addressing identified sidewalk gaps.

## **5. PRESENTATION ON STATUS OF THE SAFER STREETS RICHARDSON PLAN**

Daniel Herrig, Mobility Program Manager, reviewed this item. He provided information on Safer Streets Richardson, the City's Safety Action Plan, including Action Plan milestones, Action Plan process and components, vision statement, draft of guiding principles, safety analysis of the High Injury Network, the community survey and the next steps for Safer Streets.

## **6. PRESENTATION ON ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS WITHIN RECOMMENDED 2026 BOND PROGRAM COMPOSITION**

Daniel Herrig reviewed this item. He provided information on the 2026 Bond Program Council briefing history, and the budget for these projects. Projects will address traffic signal rebuilds, new traffic signals, active transportation and other projects. Total cost of Transportation & Mobility projects is approximately \$17.6 million. He also discussed projects from other categories that will provide active transportation elements, including Streets projects which are along corridors in the Active Transportation Plan, trail elements from Parks and Recreation, and the sidewalk program composed of both sidewalk rehabilitation and funds for addressing sidewalk gaps.

## **7. PRESENTATION ON STATUS OF SAFE ROUTE TO SCHOOL PLANNING**

Daniel Herrig reviewed this item. Dover Elementary's Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Plan was completed in July 2025 with implementation ongoing Mark Twain Elementary SRTS Plan is ongoing and anticipates completion by summer of 2026. The Richardson SRTS Program is funded through NCTCOG's Transportation Alternatives Program, and the funding agreement is currently being developed by TxDOT. The project is anticipated to begin in fall 2026.

## **8. PRESENTATION ON STATUS OF ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS UNDER DESIGN OR CONSTRUCTION**

Daniel Herrig reviewed this item. The US-75 Crossing at Belt Line was submitted for funding in February 2025; however, funding was not awarded by TxDOT. The City is coordinating with NCTCOG to explore alternative funding opportunities. He also provided an update on the status of active transportation projects that are under design or construction.

## **9. REPORT ON ITEMS OF COMMUNITY INTEREST**

Michael Deasy reported on items of community interest. The City of Richardson is participating in the Healthier Texas Community Challenge. The challenge is available from February 2nd and ends on March 29th. Using a free smartphone app, participants can report daily activities such as drinking water, exercising, and eating healthy.
